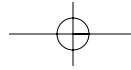

**T**his exhibition highlights gardens as design, as places of sociability, and as historic monuments — from the Villa d'Este and Versailles to New York's Central Park — in 180 artworks by 100 artists. *The Changing Garden* includes prints, drawings, photographs, and paintings by such artists as Bruegel, Piranesi, Fragonard, Robert, Pissarro, Prendergast, Sargent, Whistler, Atget, and Oldenberg. The exhibition is accompanied by a fully illustrated catalogue.

**A** sculpted landscape, designed by Meg Webster, complements the exhibition. This newly installed garden near the Cantor Arts Center features shaped concrete benches on berms planted with California native shrubs, perennials, grasses, bulbs, and annuals.

The exhibition and catalogue are supported by the late Dr. A. Jess Shenson, an anonymous donor, and the Ducommun and Gross Family Foundation.
